



Phuket Announcement

Title : Recommendations for social, traditional and ritual activities such as weddings, ancestor worship, merit making, funerals, Songkran, family functions, or previously arranged Government activities in Phuket province can still be held as necessary but must follow the measures of preventing and curbing the spread of Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19)

For the benefits of preventing and curbing a communicable disease or disease outbreak or suspected of having a communicable disease in Phuket province, according to section 22 and 35 of Communicable Disease Act of B.E.2558 (2015) together with the decision of Committee of Communicable Disease of Phuket Province meeting section 10/2020 dated on March 28, 2020, it is requested that the Public follow the measures of preventing and curbing the spread of Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) regulation no.11 by section 9 of Emergency Decree on Public Administration in Emergency Situation, B.E. 2548 (2005) (version 1) when holding social, traditional and ritual activities such as weddings, ancestor worship, merit making, funerals, Songkran, family functions and government activities in Phuket province as follows:

- 1.To clean all surfaces or floors of places with which you may contact before carrying out any activities and eliminate any waste every day.
2. To ask owners, employees, participants, and concerned persons to wear face masks and wash their hand with soap or alcohol gel or disinfectant, and also prepare alcohol gel or disinfectant, for persons who come to obtain a service. Furthermore, please arrange seating or standing so that each person is at least 1 meter apart to prevent the spread of disease by saliva droplets.
3. To control the numbers to avoid crowding and restrict the time spent in the activity to avoid direct contact between participants.

Penalties for any persons who violate or fail to comply with this announcement according to section 52 of the Communicable Disease Act of B.E. 2558 range from less than one (1) year in prison or a fine of up to 100,000 baht or both.

Effective from March 29, 2020 until otherwise announced or cancelation.
